Caring Campus Certification

- Membership in the Caring Campus Network makes you eligible to apply as an institution for Caring Campus Certification
- The application is a self-study that asks you to provide evidence that you meet various criteria indicating an ongoing commitment to Caring Campus
- Applications will be reviewed by IEBC, and if enough criteria are met, your college or university will be named a Bronze, Silver, or Gold Certified Caring Campus for two years
- This comes with a physical award as well as a digital badge



Caring Campus Certification

- The digital badge can be used in most of your communications, such as on your website, in email signatures, or on physical items such as shirts and banners
- Certification lasts for two years (as long as your institution remains a Network member during that period)
- IEBC will confirm or verify certification to third parties upon request
- A member institution can reapply during any application window



Caring Campus Certification

- Criteria categories:
 - Training and hiring
 - Accountability and data use
 - Role of leadership
 - Celebration and culture
 - Messaging
- Gold Certification is only available to institutions that have implemented Caring Campus for both Staff and Faculty
